## Managing the Impact of Wildfires on the Communities and the Environment



### Nebraska State Summary from Department of the Interior

Based on the National Fire Plan, the Department of the Interior (DOI) will implement a number of program actions to reduce hazardous fuels and their adverse effects on forest and range lands, mitigate the impacts of severe wildfires on rural communities, and enhance firefighting capabilities. In Nebraska, those actions will include the following:

#### Firefighting Resources

- Hire five additional permanent employees and four additional temporary and career seasonal employees; convert one position to a more permanent status
- Invest \$168,480 in the maintenance/construction one facility

#### Rehabilitation and Restoration

Complete emergency stabilization on 45,000 burned acres - \$111,000

#### Hazardous Fuels Reduction

- Treat fuels on 1,719 acres in wildland-urban interface areas - \$50,000
- Treat 23,329 acres to maintain/restore range or forest health - \$653,000

#### Community Assistance

For FY 2001, the DOI was appropriated \$10 million to initiate a pilot program of grants to rural fire districts. The Department expects to assist approximately 830 rural volunteer fire departments nationwide with training, equipment, and supplies to increase their level of preparedness for wildland firefighting.
